1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Tamworth Motorcycle Club, hereafter called the Promoter will conduct Quirindi Longtrack Grand Prix for Senior & Junior Track riders at the Quirindi Showground on Saturday 20th May & 21st May 2023.

1.1 Supplementary Rain off schedule: If the meeting has been postponed for the reason of force majeure the date will be This meeting will not be rerun if it rains If the rain date cannot be run in its entirety, but the meeting has reached 75% for all competitors, then a result may be declared by the steward based on the points at the time of the determination. If it has not reached 75%, then the event will be declared null and void and further decisions of status of this event are at the discretion of Motorcycling Australia.

2. JURISDICTION

2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by MNSW which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number [Insert Permit Number] and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Open Licenses One event licenses are available but the rider and or passenger must have held an MA license at some stage of their riding career to acquire a one event license. And must be pre ordered through Tamworth MCC a least 2 weeks prior to the race meeting date.

2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by MNSW. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Entries are now open via email - joslade57@hotmail.com and Mail - 10 Lennox St Quirindi 2343 and close last mail 13th May 2022 Late entries will not be accepted.

4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Tamworth Motorcycle Club if such retention is approved by MNSW.

4.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.

4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs Tamworth Motorcycle Club, in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event.

5. ENTRY FEE

5.1 Senior & Junior Classes will be **1st class \$130** and **\$30** for every other class entered.

5.2 Payment by Direct deposit into clubs account BSB 032621 Account number 209217 Name and bike number as reference also attached your receipt of payment to your entry form. Any fees for dishonored cheques will be the responsibility of the entrant.

5.3 Cheques and Money Orders are to be made payable to the Tamworth Motorcycle Club.

5.4 All correspondence will be done via email if given your email and our clubs Face book page.

6. ENTRY PASSES

All Senior and Junior riders will have their names at the entry gate along with 1 mechanic only.

All Senior Sidecars and their passengers will have their name at the entry gate along with 1 mechanic only.

7. INSURANCE

7.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.

7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Beneficial and Safety Paramedics.

9. SCRUTINEERING

9.1 Scrutineering will begin on Friday the 19th May 2023 from 4pm and Saturday the 20th May 2023 from **7am**

9.2 Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.

9.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.

9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

10. CLASSES OF CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION

1) Up to 250cc Open Slider & MX frame if enough sliders enter the sliders will be separated into their own class.

- 4) 500cc Slider

- 16) Up to 150cc 2 stroke / 250cc 4 stroke Junior Open 13 to Under 16 years

Please note there will be an over 40s Final and an over 52 years final

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

11.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Grand Prix status, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be (8) Eight Solos and (5) Five Sidecars (5) Five Quads.

Please note if our club gets enough 2 Valve entries our club will run them separate to the Evos and if our club gets enough Pre 90 flat track, they will also run separate from the Hooligans.

11.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prizemoney, will be at the discretion of the Tamworth Motorcycle Club, subject to MNSW approval.

12. STARTS AND FINISHES

Starts will be Speedway type tapes and finishing will be by Checkered Flag waved by Jeff Garnham.

13. FLAGS AND SIGNALS

Red, Yellow and Green lights will be displayed around the racetrack along with flag Marshalls on the infield with the red and yellow flags.

14. RACE FORMAT

All Grand Prix Classes will be run under 3 Qualifying heats, One Reperchage and One final.

Classes with only One grid will be run over 5 rounds.

17. PAYG

PAYG Withholding affects the payment of prizemoney. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter must withhold 46.5% of prizemoney over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you. Please tick one of the boxes on the entry form and if appropriate provide your ABN to ensure the full amount of prize money is paid to you.

18. PRESENTATIONS

Will be done on the infield after the last final is run.

19. MACHINES AND RIDERS

19.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Track competition.

19.2 Multiple entries of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

19.3 Change of machine is allowed only if the bike has not been raced in that class.

20. RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Tamworth Motorcycle Club discretion.

All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required MA decal. All riders must have their race number displayed on their back with the correct colour Black numbers with White background.

21. GRID POSITIONS

Pre drawn and printed in the program.

22. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

23. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

760 meters of Granite and cracker dust surface

24. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

24.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course if those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

25. FACILITIES

Toilets and Showers are available for use by the patrons.

Camping will be \$25 per camp site per night

26. NOISE

As per MOMS

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course. Refer to MOMS for details.

27. TYRES

NO Knobby tyres are allowed on bikes above 85cc including Quads.

28. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

28.1 All competitors, crew, parents / guardians and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, under the authority of Sport Integrity Australia.

28.2 Athletes are advised to download the Sports Integrity Australia app. If athletes have any doubts over Sports Integrity Australia requirements, they should visit the website www.sportintegrity.gov.au

It is recommended athletes contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline (1300 027 232) for further information. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed, at the discretion of MA, until the results of the tests are known.

29. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

30. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Codes of Behaviour contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at www.ma.org.au which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. These Codes of Behaviour apply to this meeting and will be enforced.

31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders must have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

32. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

All competitors, officials and parents are bound by of MA's Social Media Policy, found at www.ma.org.au, which sets out a framework for acceptable online behavior where communications involve fellow MA members, volunteers, officials, coaches, sponsors, partners, staff and any other connected persons, penalties may apply for breaches of the policy.

33. ADMISSION CHARGES

Adults (16) years and over will be \$20 each day.

All Pensioners will be \$15 each day.

Kids (15) years and under will be \$10 each day.

Kids under 10 are free each day.

Family 1 day pass 2 Adults and 2 Children \$50 each day.

BYO Alcohol- No glass bottles are to be brought on to the Showground, cans and plastic only if you are caught with glass, it will be confiscated.

34. ENVIROMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

All teams and riders are responsible for the removal of all items including rubbish from their pit area as they vacate the premises.

Penalties may apply as per GCR 6.1.1.1 a)

Used tyres cannot be left on site. Any rider found to have left tyres in the pit area will be fined for the cost of their disposal.

35: Camping

If you are camping, few things you need to know.

Please, put all your rubbish in the bins provided, do not leave your rubbish lying around your camp site for us to clean up on Sunday. Please take your rubbish with you, your camp site is your responsibility to keep clean.

If you require or feel the need to have a fire at your camp site, you must provide your own **fire pit** and wood these will not be provided for you. Under **NO** circumstances are fires allowed to be lit on open ground, this is a requirement from the Quirindi Council so please adhered to this.
