#### 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Coffs Harbour Motorcycle Club, hereafter called the Promoter will conduct the Adventure Powersports & Outdoor - NSW Senior Track Championship at the Coffs Harbour Motorcycle Club Complex, Phil Hawthorn Drive Coffs Harbour on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> July & Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

1.1 Supplementary Rain off schedule: If the meeting has been postponed for the reason of force majeure the meeting will not be rerun. If the meeting has reached 75% for all competitors, then a result may be declared by the steward based on the points at the time of the determination. If it has not reached 75%, then the event will be declared null and void and further decisions of status of this event are at the discretion of Motorcycling New South Wales.

#### 2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by MNSW which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number TK/23/O/04110 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Open Licenses One event licenses are available through Ridernet only. The rider and or passenger must have previously held an MA license at some stage of their riding career to acquire a one event license.
- 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by MNSW. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

## 4. ENTRIES

- 4.1 Entries are now open via Ridernet closing Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July.

  Late entries will be accepted until the 21<sup>st</sup> July at the discretion of the promoter and will incur a \$50 late fee.
- 4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Coffs Harbour Motorcycle Club if such retention is approved by MNSW.
- 4.3 Only entries received via Ridernet will be accepted.
- 4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs the Race Secretary, in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event. All refunds less an admifee.

#### **5. ENTRY FEE**

- 5.1 Senior Championship Classes will be
  - 1st class \$130
  - \$30 for each additional class

## Support Classes Junior & Senior will be

- 1st class \$80
- \$30 for each additional class
- 5.2 Payment online via Ridernet
- 5.3 All correspondence will be issued via email and the Coffs Harbour Motorcycle clubs Facebook page.



#### 6. ENTRY PASSES

- All Solo riders will receive 2 passes (rider and mechanic)
- All Sidecars will receive 3 passes. (rider/passenger and mechanic)

#### 7. INSURANCE

- 7.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

#### 8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Beneficial First Aid Medical service will be in place for the duration of this event.

#### 9. SCRUTINEERING

- 9.1 Scrutineering will begin at 7am
- 9.2 Machines entered in the competition must successfully pass machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.
- 9.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.
- 9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.
- 9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

#### 11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

11.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be (10) Ten Solos and (6) Six for Sidecars, ATV & Pro Women Classes.

Pre 90 Open & Flat Track Twins may be combined depending on entries received.

All Junior Classes capped at 12 riders.

11.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prize money, will be at the discretion of the promoter, subject to MNSW approval.

#### 12. STARTS AND FINISHES

Starts will be by backward falling self penalising gates, finish will be by Checkered Flag.

#### 13. FLAGS AND SIGNALS

#### 14. RACE FORMAT

- 14.1 All competitors shall be given one (1) practice session of a minimum of two (2) laps.
  - 14.2 Where there are twelve (12) or less Solo entries per class the championship comprises five (5) races of four (4) laps. Points accumulated by each competitor in the 5 races will determine Championship placings. This will also include the support classes.
- 14.3 Where there are more than twelve (12) Solo competitors entered and competing in a class the championship shall comprise of:
  - a) Four (4) qualifying heats of four (4) laps.
  - b) One (1) race repechage of four (4) laps; and
  - c) One (1) final comprising of six (6) laps.
- 14.4 The repechage will be contested by competitors who finish 11th to 22nd inclusive during the course of the heats.
- 14.5 The right to compete in the final will be filled by: -

The ten (10) competitors accumulating the highest number of points during the course of heats.

The first two (2) placing of the repechage. The finishing order of each competitor in the final will determine championship placings. Grid positions as per points choose first

- 14.6 Where there are more than six (6) Sidecars, Women and/or ATV's entered and competing in a class the Championship shall comprise of:
  - > 3 qualifying heats of 4 laps
  - 1 race repechage of 4 laps; and
  - 1 race final comprising of 5 laps
- 14.7 The repechage will be contested be competitors who finish 6th to 11th inclusive during the course of heats;



- 14.8 The right to compete in the final will be filled by:
  - > The 5 competitors accumulating the highest number of points during the course of heats;
  - > The first placing of the repechage. The finishing order of each competitor in the final will determine the Championship placings
- 14.9 All races will be scored using the scoring system as per GCRs Chapter 13.11.11.1 Scoring

## **17. PAYG**

#### 18. PRESENTATIONS

Will be held at the canteen following the last race.

#### 19. MACHINES AND RIDERS

- 19.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Track competition.
- 19.2 Multiple entries of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 19.3 Change of machine is allowed with prior permission of the clerk and cannot have previously been raced in the competition class at the event.

#### 20. RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. If this is not possible numbers will be allocated they will be allocated by the Race Secretary.

All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required MA decal.

#### 21. GRID POSITIONS

Pre drawn and printed in the program.

#### 22. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

#### 23. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Clay / Granite surface

- Track 630m long
- TT 480m Long
- Demo 300m Long

## 24. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

#### 24.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course if those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

#### 25. FACILITIES

Canteen, Full Canteen Operating During the Event

Toilets and Showers (Male and Female toilets with limited shower) are available at the venue.

#### **26. NOISE**

All machines must comply with the GCR's, Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course.

## **27. TYRES**

Knobby Tyres are NOT PERMITTED on bikes above 85cc, including Quads



#### 28. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

28.1 All competitors, crew, parents / guardians and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, under the authority of Sport Integrity Australia.

28.2 Athletes are advised to download the Sports Integrity Australia app. If athletes have any doubts over Sports Integrity Australia requirements they should visit the website <a href="www.sportintegrity.gov.au">www.sportintegrity.gov.au</a>
It is recommended athletes contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline (1300 027 232) for further information. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed, at the discretion of MA, until the results of the tests are known.

#### 29. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

#### 30. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Codes of Behaviour contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at <a href="www.ma.org.au">www.ma.org.au</a> which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. These Codes of Behaviour apply to this meeting and will be enforced.

#### 31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders must have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

#### 32. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

All competitors, officials and parents are bound by of MA's Social Media Policy, found at <a href="www.ma.org.au">www.ma.org.au</a>, which sets out a framework for acceptable online behavior where communications involve fellow MA members, volunteers, officials, coaches, sponsors, partners, staff and any other connected persons, penalties may apply for breaches of the policy.

## 33. ADMISSION CHARGES

Adults (16) years and over will be \$10 Children (15) years and under will be \$5 Children under 10 are free

No glass containers are permitted at the venue, cans and plastic only

#### 34. ENVIROMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

All teams and riders are responsible for the removal of all items including rubbish from their pit area as they vacate the premises. Penalties may apply as per GCR 5.1.1.1 a)

Used tyres cannot be left on site. Any rider found to have left tyres in the pit area will be fined for the cost of their disposal.



## 34. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

34.1		NO CAMPING PERMITTED AT THE VENUE
34.2	Injuries:	All injuries MUST be reported to the Clerk of the Course
34.3	Pit Area:	Riding in the pits is only permitted on the centre lane from the track to the Pit gate AT A WALKING SPEED Only the rider and 1 mechanics are allowed in the pit area. NO PUBLIC PERMITTED. NO CHILDERN UNDER THE AGE OF 16YRS IN PIT AREA UNLESS COMPETING IN THE MEETING. Pushbikes Electric Balance Bikes and scooters are not allowed in the pit area. ENCLOSED footwear must be worn at all times. NO ALCOHOL IN THE PIT AREA. Any breach may result in exclusion of the meeting.
34.4	Car Park:	Riding of machines in the car park is not permitted. All bikes must be walked out from the pit area to the car park.
34.5	Animals:	Animals are not permitted within the confines of the complex unless they are being used to alleviate a person's disability. Anyone found to have brought an animal onto the premises will be asked to leave.
34.6	Scorer's Box:	The scorer's box is off limits to all persons. Exemptions will be made to officials of the meeting.
34.7	Supervision	ALL children under the age of 12 MUST be supervised by an adult at all times for their safety. All minors (under 18yrs of age) are the responsibility of their parents/carers.
34.8	Final Instructions	Final instructions will be posted on the Coffs Harbour Motorcycle Club's Facebook page.
