1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Hunter Motorcycle Club, hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct Trackmasters 2024 and the Golden Helmet Challenge for Senior and Junior Solo's, Demonstration Solo's, Senior and Senior ATVs for Track at the Barleigh Ranch Raceway on 15th & 16th June 2024

2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1. The above-mentioned OPEN meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling NSW Limited who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number TBA and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National Competition Licences.
- 2.2. Day licences are accepted and must be obtained on ridernet before the meeting.
- 2.3. The meeting will be held in accordance with the current 2024 General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of Motorcycling NSW and any final instructions.

BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1 Entries open forthwith and close on the 5th June 2024 online Only on ridernet
- 3.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the promoter, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling NSW.
- 3.3 Only entries received on the Ridernet and accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 3.4 NOTE: LATE ENTRIESMAYBE ACCEPTED OR REJECTED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE RACE SECRETARY, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE RACE COMMITTEE OR CLUB EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND THE RETURN OF ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CLUB.

4. INSURANCE:

4.1 National Capital Benefits Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.



- 4.2 Personal Accident and Ambulance Insurance is the responsibility of the individual.
- 4.3 IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT SUCH INSURANCE COVER.

5. MEDICAL SERVICES:

Intercept Medical Services will be in attendance from 9.00am until the completion of racing on both Saturday and Sunday.

6. ENTRY FEE:

6.1 Senior Solo: \$100 first class \$60 for each additional class
Junior Solo \$60 first class \$40 for each additional class

50ccDemonstration Class: \$40.00 Senior ATV's: \$100 6.2 Payment by card on ridernet when entering.

7. ENTRY PASSES:

No passes required.

The GOLDEN HELMET was the idea of the late Max Troth a life member of the Wallsend District Motorcycle Club. The trophy is GOLD plated and was first raced for in 1965 at Heddon Greta just near Kurri Kurri and was awarded to the winner of the solo handicap, unfortunately when the Track was changed to a Speedway the trophy was put away for a number of years, and in 1974 it was awarded to the best performing rider/s for the year in the Wallsend Club.

10. PAYG WITHOUT HOLDING:

The Pay As You Go Tax affects the payment of prize money. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter may withhold 47% of prize money over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you. Please tick one of the boxes on the entry form and if appropriate provide your ABN to ensure the full amount of prize moneys paid to you.

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

11.1 To constitute a class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be.

Solo's: 8 riders ATV's: 6 riders Girls: 6 riders

All Junior Classes will have a minimum of 6 riders per class.

11.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prize money, will be at the discretion of the promoter, subject to Motorcycling NSW approval.

11. RACE FORMAT:

SOLO

Where there are 12 riders or more.

There will be 3 rounds of qualifying heats of 3 laps.

1 Repechage of 4 laps

1 Final of 5 laps

Riders finishing 1st to 10th in the heats will progress to the Final.

Riders finishing 11th to 22nd after the qualifying heats will contest the repechage.

1st and 2nd in the repechage will progress to the final.

Where there are less than 12 riders the class will be run over 5 rounds of 3 laps

ATV

Where there are 6 riders or more

There will be 3 rounds of qualifying heats of 3 laps.

1 repechage of 4 laps

1 final of 5 laps

Riders finishing 1st to 5th in the heats will progress to the final.

Riders finishing 6th to 11th after the qualifying heats will contest the repechage.

1st and 2nd in the repechage will progress to the Final.

11.2 Scoring will be as per GCR's.

11.3 Results will remain "Provisional" until ratified and confirmed by Motorcycling NSW.

11.4 THE CLUB RESERVES THE RIGHT TO VARY THIS IF NECESSARY.

THE GOLDEN HELMET CHALLENGE.

The Golden Helmet challenge will be contested by the first 4 finishers of the pro Open Class plus 1 other rider of the club's choice.

Over a SHOOT OUT system where the club's choice rider will race the rider who finished 4th in the Trackmasters Unlimited Final over 2 laps.

The winner will then progress to the next challenger, with the rider who finished 3^{rd.}

This will be repeated until we get to the last 2 riders.

The winner of this shootout name will be added to the GOLDEN HELMET and receive a replica GOLDEN HELMET plus CASH

12. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 12.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for track competition.
- 12.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 12.3There will be no change of machines once the competition has commenced.
- 12.4 Noise &/or Fuel Testing may be carried out at any time during this meeting.

13. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 13.1 Competitors will be allocated their Motorcycling NSW Registered Riding Number or their preferred riding number if available.

 All others shall be allocated numbers at the Hunter Motorcycle Club's discretion.
- 13.2 All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCR's.
- 13.3 Back Numbers must comply with the GCR's that is white background with black numbers.



14.1 Grid positions will be pre drawn and printed in the program, and if found to move from this assigned position will be excluded from that race.

14.2Grid positions for the repechages/finals will be chosen by the highest point scorer having first choice & so on

15.RIDERS BRIEFING:

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of practice and ALL COMPETITORS MUST ATTEND.

16 DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

By order of Motorcycling NSW, random drug &/or alcohol testing of participants (i.e., officials, competitors, mechanics, pit crew and any other person associated with the control, direction, and operation of the competition) may take place prior to, or at any time during this meeting.

17 CODE OF CONDUCT:

All participants, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated at http://www.ma.org.au/fileadmin/user_upload/Documents/Member_Benefits/Member_Protection_Policy_2.3.pdf) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this meeting and shall be enforced.

For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 7.30am Saturday and Sunday with the completion of the meeting for the participant being at the completion of all racing.

19. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

The circuit is approximately 650 metres in length; the surface is graded and rolled Rhyolite.

Racing will be in an anti-clockwise direction.

20. STARTS:

The starts will be from a drop forward gate on a concrete pad.

The maximum number of riders per event will be 12 Solo, 6 ATV's.

**500cc Sliders will start at finish line with lights when ready a red light will appear the start of the race will be when the red light goes out.

Any rider found to have jump started will be relegated 3 places after the race has finished.

50ccDemonstration riders will be started 1 at a time - no mass start.

21. *RACING*:

All riders will be given 2 laps practice per bike.

All heats will be over 3 laps.

All repechages will be over 4 laps.

All finals will be over solo's 5 Laps.

All 50ccDemonstration Div 1 will be held on the 300-metre track inside the main track and will be held over 8 laps.

Slider Class will be contested on Sunday ONLY.

The Club reserves the right to vary this if necessary.



AS THE CLUB IS UNDER STRICT COUNCIL REQUIREMENTS THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

- 2)FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: All competitors should have a minimum 2kg, dry power A: B (E) class, working fire extinguishers in their pit area.
- 3) **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION:** A protective, absorbent mat that measures 500mm x 500mm or greater must be placed underneath the engine/gearbox and fuel tank of any bike while parked in the pit area.

23. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

Please note:

It is intended to run this meeting as a 2-day meeting with:

Juniors only on Saturday

&

Seniors only on Sunday.

The reason being is to save people travelling and overnight accommodation expenses.

- 23.1 <u>Presentation:</u> The presentation will take place at the back of the sign on shed as soon as possible after the final race Saturday of juniors and Sunday for seniors
- 23.2 <u>Facilities:</u> Canteen facilities will be available from 8.00am on Sat and Sun. Toilet facilities are septic system.
- 23.3 Tyres: Knobbly tyres are not permitted on any machine over 85/150cc. Please note Tyres rules for seniors.
- 23.4 <u>Admission Charges:</u> \$20 charge for spectators per vehicle Sunday Only
- 23.5 Off Limits: The score tower is OFF limits with the exception of the OFFICIALS of the meeting.
- 23.6 Marshals: A roster for corner Marshals will be drawn up and printed in the program.
 - Riders from Hunter MCC will need to supply a marshal this will include SENIOR riders so don't forget to BRING A FRIEND
- 23.7 Animals: No animals are permitted in this complex with the exception of guide dogs. (See GCR notice 4.4)
- 23.8 <u>Pit Area:</u> Children under the age of 16 are not permitted in the pit/paddock area unless they are a competitor. All persons entering the pit /paddock area must be wearing enclosed footwear.
- 23.9 NO CAMPING IS PERMITTED AT BARLEIGH RANCH due to local Council regulations.
