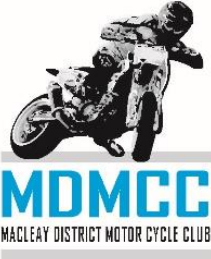

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS



1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Macleay District Motorcycle Club, hereafter called the Promoter will conduct the 33rd Akubra Classic 2024 for Dirt Track at the Greenhill Speedway, 15 Alverton Street Greenhill NSW 2440, on 22nd and 23rd February 2025.

1.1 Supplementary Rain off schedule: If the meeting has been postponed for the reason of force majeure the date will be TBA. If the rain date cannot be run in its entirety, but the meeting has reached 75% for all competitors, then a result may be declared by the steward based on the points at the time of the determination. If it has not reached 75%, then the event will be declared null and void and further decisions of status of this event are at the discretion of Motorcycling Australia.

2. JURISDICTION

2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling NSW which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number [Insert Permit Number] and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia competition Licences.

2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling NSW. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Entries are now open via Ridernet and close last mail Friday the 7th February 2025. Late entries will be accepted until Wednesday 12th February 2025. Late entries will occur a \$50 late fee. No entries will be accepted after 12th February 2025.

4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Macleay District Motorcycle Club, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling NSW.

4.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.

4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs Macleay District Motorcycle Club, in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event.

5. ENTRY FEE

5.1 Championship classes –

Akubra Classic 2024 Senior 1st Class \$125 Each additional class \$25 per extra class.

Junior Support 2024 -1st class \$100 entry, Each additional class \$25 per extra class.

50cc Demonstration - \$50

Support Class Only, \$100 each Additional class \$25 per extra class.

5.2 Payment by Ridernet online payments only. Any fees for dishonoured cheques will be the responsibility of the entrant.

6. ENTRY PASSES

Gate Admissions – Saturday & Sunday: A rider list will be at the gate allowing rider and mechanic entry only. Side cars will receive 2 riders and 1 mechanic entry. All others entering are to pay an Admission fee of \$10 per day. Children under the age of 5 are free.

7. INSURANCE

7.1 Those who hold an MA licence current for the duration of the Event, and officials, who are signed on for the Event are covered by MA's National Personal Accident Scheme which provides basic cover for rehabilitation expenses and death and permanent disability benefits. 7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

9. SCRUTINEERING

9.1 Scrutineering will begin at 7.30am

9.2 Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.

9.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.

9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

11.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be 10 or more starters for the Akubra Classic solo classes which actually participate in practice, qualifying or races.

For side car and ATV Classes, the number to constitute a class will be 6 or more which actually participate in practice, qualifying or races.

For Girls & Women's classes the number to constitute a class will be 5 which actually participate in practice, qualifying or races.

For the support classes, the number to constitute a class will be 6 who actually participate in practice, qualifying or races.

Demos will be capped at 18 riders.

11.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prizemoney, will be at the discretion of the Macleay District Motorcycle Club, subject to Motorcycling NSW approval.

12. STARTS AND FINISHES

12.1 All starts are from backwards falling self-penalising gates.

12.2 Procedure- A 10 second board will be displayed to all riders. At any time after the 10 second board has been displayed, a 5 second board will be displayed. Any time after the 5 second board has been displayed the gates will drop.

12.3 Finishes will be conducted as per 2025 GCR 13.10.7 and GCR 13.10.8

13. FLAGS AND SIGNALS

Flags to be used as per appendix B Chapter 17.2 of the Manual of Motorcycle Sport.

14. RACE FORMAT

14.1 All competitors shall be given one (1) practice session of a minimum of two (2) laps.

14.2 Where there are twelve (12) or less solo entries per class the championship comprises of five (5) races of four (4) laps. Points accumulated by each competitor in the 5 races will determine Championship placings.

14.3 Where there are more than twelve (12) solo competitors entered and competing in a class the championship shall comprise of: -

(a) 4 qualifying heats of 4 laps

(b) 1 race repechage of 4 laps

(c) 1 race final comprising of 5 laps except the Akubra Classic Solo.

(d) 1 race final comprising of 10 laps for the Akubra Classic Solo

14.4 The repechage will be contested by competitors who finish 11th to 22nd inclusive during the course of the heats.

14.5 The right to compete in the final will be filled by: -

(a) The 10 competitors accumulating the highest number of points during the heats,

(b) The first 2 placings of the repechage. The finishing order of each competitor in the final will determine Championship placings.

14.6 Sidecars and ATV's. Where there are 6 or more riders

There will be 4 rounds of qualifying heats of 4 laps.

Riders finishing 1st to 4th in the heats will progress to the final.

Riders finishing 5th to 10th after the qualifying heats will contest the repechage of 4 laps.

1st and 2nd in the repechage will progress to the final of 5 laps

Where there are less than 6 riders, the class will run over 5 rounds of 4 laps.

14.7 All races will be scored using the scoring system as per GCRs Chapter 13.10.11.1

14.8 Results will remain provisional until ratified and confirmed by Motorcycling NSW.

14.9 SUPPORT/DEMONSTRATION CLASS: 50cc 4 to Under 9 Years Demo Class will demonstrate over five (5) rounds of five (5) minutes timed demonstration.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 7.30 am, with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

16. AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY

Trophies will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place getters in each class.

All demonstration riders will receive an award of equal value.

17. PAYG

PAYG Withholding affects the payment of prizemoney. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter must withhold 46.5% of prizemoney over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you. Please tick one of the boxes on the entry form and if appropriate provide your ABN to ensure the full amount of prize money is paid to you.

18. PRESENTATIONS

The presentation will be advised at Riders Briefing on Sunday.

19. MACHINES AND RIDERS

19.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Dirt Track competition.

19.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

19.3 Change of machine is not permitted under any circumstances once the first qualifying heat or round of competition of a given class has commenced.

19.4 Any machine damaged during the course of competition must be re-examined prior to being allowed to re-compete.

19.5 Noise &/or Fuel Testing may be carried out at any time during the meeting.

19.6 Back protectors are mandatory and must be worn.

20. RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Macleay District Motorcycle Club discretion.

All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required MA decal.



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21. GRID POSITIONS

Grid positions will be pre-drawn and printed in the program
Grid position for the repechage/final will be chosen by the highest point score having first choice & so on.

22. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

23. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

The circuit length is 605 meters and constructed of oiled loam. Racing is anti-clockwise.
Entry to this area is strictly for Officials and Competitors of the event in place.
Entry to all others is prohibited unless authorized by the Clerk of the Course.

24. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

24.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course if those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

25. FACILITIES

Full Canteen Facilities will be available both days.
Camping is available for competitors and officials. Camping will be available from lunch time Friday 21st February 2025. Camping will be \$20 per camp per night for the weekend.

26. NOISE

All machines must comply with the requirements of the GCR's and the track licence.

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course. Refer to Chapter 13 of the M.O.M.S for details.

27. TYRES

Knobby Tyres are not permitted on any machine over 50cc. Circuit is constructed of oiled loam

28. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

28.1 All competitors, crew, parents / guardians and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, under the authority of Sport Integrity Australia.

28.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, ph: 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at Motorcycling NSW discretion until the results of the tests are known.

29. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

30. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's zero tolerance of poor behaviour, either on or off track. The codification of the behaviors expected of MA members and all who attend or participate in motorcycling is contained within MA's policies, including its Member Welfare Policy and its Social Media Policy, which can be found at Policies - [Motorcycling Australia \(ma.org.au\)](http://Motorcycling Australia (ma.org.au)).

31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders must have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area.

32. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

All competitors, officials and parents are bound by of MA's Social Media Policy, found at www.ma.org.au, which sets out a framework for acceptable online behavior where communications involve fellow MA members, volunteers, officials, coaches, sponsors, partners, staff and any other connected persons, penalties may apply for breaches of the policy.

33. ADMISSION CHARGES

\$10 per day per person. Children under 5 years free.

34. ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

All teams and riders are responsible for the removal of all items including rubbish from their pit area as they vacate the premises. Penalties may apply as per GCR's – Manual of Motorcycle Sport. Used tyres cannot be left on site. Any rider found to have left tyres in the pit area will be fined for the cost of their disposal.

34. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

34.1 Presentation will take place as soon as possible after the final race once results are finalised and location will be advised at Riders Briefing.

34.2 Flag Marshals: Flag Marshals will be provided by Macleay District Motorcycle Club Inc.

34.3 Off Limits: The Score tower is OFF limits with the exception of the OFFICIALS of the meeting.

34.4 NO ANIMALS are allowed in this complex with the exception of guide dogs and Assistant Animals.

34.5 PIT AREA: NO children under the age of 16 are allowed in the pit/paddock area unless they are a competitor.

34.6 ALL persons entering the pit /paddock area must be wearing enclosed footwear.

34.7 FINAL INSTRUCTIONS will be emailed to riders.

34.8 NO Pushbikes/ electric balance bikes allowed during the course of the meeting.
